
## Class 4: SPATIAL RELATIONSHIP & LEVELS

## **COMPOSITION ASSIGNMENT** 2: TELLING A STORY WITH OBJECTS AND SPATIAL RELATIONSHIPS

- 1. Each participant directs a Composition on her/his own, using objects as actors.
- 2. The stage is the top of a table.
- 3. Tell a story in three tableaux, divided by blackouts, on the tabletop using only the objects. The story should be expressed by the placement of the objects, their distance from one another and what happens to them simply in the development of Spatial Relationship in the three tableaux.

Allow fifteen minutes for preparation of these Compositions. In this exercise, think of the tabletop as the entire world. Introducing any object onto the table creates a dramatic situation.
